Matters arising from previous meeting:

Minute No: 139/24

Ryde Town Council have been informed that Bembridge Parish Council has agreed to supply £300 of partnership funding towards the Information Support Service based in Ryde Library.

Bembridge Parish Council's application to the Local Council Awards Scheme for a Silver Award has been processed by the National Association of Local Councils and we have received the latest update:

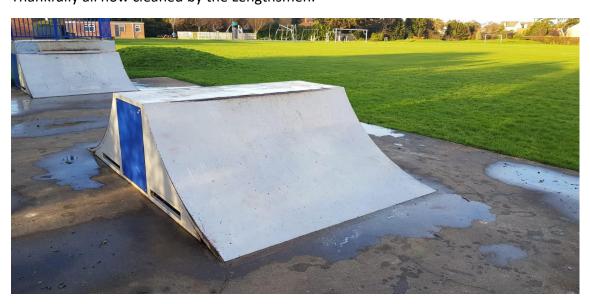
Office/Lengthsmen updates:

Finally, Police Community Support Officer Steve Hull will be holding his first 'surgery' in the back room of the Parish Office on the morning of Monday 20th January. I'll update further details on how this progressed on the night of the meeting.

Items on the Agenda:

Agenda item 7.1: Updated 3-year Business Plan

The updated financial analysis for 2024/25 carried out by the Finance & Governance Committee has shown that following strict budgetary control and an internal restructuring process to maximize efficiencies, the Parish Council is now in a position that allows it to reforecast the Business Plan and reduce the annual year on year increases needed to achieve its goals. For the year 2025/26 the year-on-year increase will now be reduced from the previously forecast 12.15% to 6.86%. 2026/27 is forecast to fall from the expected 9.45% to 6.25%, leaving 2027/28 with an expected increase of 5.5%. Each year included in the new plan is therefore now within the Parish Council's set financial objective of increases between 5%-10% year on year.

Following on from the IoW Council's decision in Feb 2024 to apply a 100% Council Tax premium to second homes, the tax base for Bembridge has increased from 2077.60 for 2024/25 to 2321.10 for 2025/26. Using this new tax base the average weekly precept for Bembridge has actually fallen by 10p per week, from £2.27 to £2.17. It is forecast that there will be an increase of 14p per week in 2026/27 and 13p per week in 2027/28.

These more modest rises in the Precept, when compared to the previous Business Plan, will still allow the Parish Council to build up reserves for its planned projects of approx. £150,000 over the period of the new Plan.

Agenda item 7.2: 2025/26 Budget

Following on from the revised Business Plan the 2025/26 Budget is presented for the Council's agreement and adoption.

Agenda item 7.3: 2025/26 Precept

Finally, the Parish Council are required to agree to request a Precept from 2025/26 of £262,398 as per the three-year Business Plan and budget for 2025/26.
