Hi both

Hope you're well. I'm writing to revisit the topic of additional storage required by the Youth Football Club at Steyne Park please.

The need:

We now have over 150 young people involved with the club from Wildcats, Mini & Midi Kickers as well as all the U7 - U15 teams . As you know, we are the reigning grassroots club of the year for all of Hampshire and the Isle of Wight and therefore continue to grow. We are getting to a point where we cannot physically store all the clubs equipment in the very limited storage facilities we have available (a solitary container) which isn't sustainable.

The latest proposal is to:

- i) clear the existing branches and debris in the target space and prepare an appropriate footing (Simon Scott Jackson has kindly offered to help with this) before....
- ii) hiring a crane from JMC Hire to move the existing container 6-8ft to the right (as shown) into the prepared space (the container is 8ft wide)
- iii) In parallel, apply for grant funding that is available to grassroots football clubs to buy another container of the same dimensions (20ft x 8ft x 8ft) and have it lifted onto the same footing as the existing container so as not to impinge on Men in Sheds area thus keeping all parties happy. The costs associated with the previously approved lean to were prohibitive and do not qualify for the conditions/requirements of the grant funding.



Happy to look at getting some cladding or a lick of paint to help to make these look a bit more attractive if need be.

Assuming this proposal is acceptable, all we'd need to apply for funding is a brief email from the Parish (as landowner) to approve it and confirmation that no planning permission (as a temporary structure) would be required.

I hope this makes sense and is something we can move forwards with relatively quickly as the club really is bulging at the seams! Feel free to give me a call to discuss if you have any questions or concerns.
